Yellowstone Slides Show Rules & Conditions

1. The Yellowstone Reining Horse Association Show Office is requiring pre-registration. This will enable the office to run more smoothly and efficiently by processing time-consuming paperwork before the show. Pre-registration minimizes congestion at the Show Office and allows for prompt posting of the draws. Please note the pre-registration deadline on the Entry Form. If the designated show deadline has not been met for pre-registration, a \$5/horse post registration fee will be assessed. As per the 2010 NRHA Handbook, the Show Secretary is required to see the horse's competition license to enter an NRHA approved competition. We ask that a copy of these papers be mailed before the YRHA show to comply with NRHA regulations. **The Entry Form with the pre-registration section completed must be sent in by the deadline date to avoid the \$5 late fee.** This will allow the Show Secretary to assign numbers to the horses prior to the show.
2. **You have the option of pre-entering classes on the enclosed Entry Form.** In order to be entered in a class, it must be paid for in advance by the pre-registration date corresponding to the show. Express check-in will be available for those who have prepaid class(es) and have met all other requirements. Waiting in line to pick up your horse number will be greatly reduced! Riders in the first two classes on Thursday morning may want to prepay those specific classes when they pre-register. The draw for the first two classes each day will be posted by 7 p.m. the night before.
3. You may add or drop classes at the show by completing provided slips at the Show Office.
4. It is the responsibility of each rider to inform the Show Office of any pre-entered class(es) he/she wishes to drop (before class closes) to avoid being charged for the class. **There will be no exceptions.**
5. Show Office will be open each day at 6:30 a.m. to process post entries. **First and second class on Thursday will close at 6:45 p.m. Wednesday.** Late entries will draw for first or last position after the official draw on all days of the show. **There will be no exceptions.**
6. Membership is not required to enter a YRHA class. However, to qualify for YRHA year-end awards, rider and horse owner must be current YRHA members prior to close of entries in the class. Year-end awards based on cumulative earnings for the season. Download membership application from YRHA website, www.yellowstonereining.com.
7. To ride in any NRHA class, one must be a current member of NRHA. To qualify for CSRHA or MRHA year-end awards, one must be a current member of Cowboy States Reining Horse Association/Montana Reining Horse Association.
8. Rookie Classes - Rookie 1 is a YRHA year-end award class, but not an affiliate class; if you wish to try to qualify for the regional affiliate finals, enter Rookie 2. **Prime Time Rookie must also enter Rookie 1 or Rookie 2, depending on eligibility.**
9. Freestyle Class - The riders using cassettes must have their tapes cued to the proper song. The riders using CDs must indicate which number on the CD their music corresponds to before submitting to Show Management. Show Management and/or the NRHA Judge reserve the right to disqualify any rider for inappropriate music, lyrics or dress.
10. Show will retain 50% of entry fee.
11. A \$5 per run video charge will be assessed for RainDancer Video. A time-delayed review will be available outside the show pen. Take advantage of this opportunity to view your run! A video of your run may be purchased from RainDancer at the show or later through raindancervideo.com.
12. Once a class is drawn, you may NOT scratch and re-enter the class.
13. For those not stalling on the grounds, there will be a one-time \$15 per horse haul-in fee to be paid at the Show Office.

If you win an award, remember to pick it up at the Awards Table *before* the end of the show.

If you win a class, have your win picture taken!

How To Pre-Register & Avoid the \$5 Per Horse Post Registration Fee

Mail the following to the YRHA Show Secretary by the specified deadline:

1. Complete the Pre-Registration section of the Entry Form (one per horse)

REQUIRED PAPERS:

2. Copy of current NRHA card. Owner & rider if different.
3. Copy of NRHA Horse Competition License or Breed Registration Papers for those who do not have an NRHA Competition License and not entering an NRHA class.
4. Copies of any other pertinent affiliate club cards (YRHA, MRHA, APHA, CSRHA).

The pre-registration process will enable the Show Secretary to run the show more efficiently for all involved. **Express check-in will be available for those who have pre-registered and/or pre-entered.**

Show Awards

Each Yellowstone Slide will award prizes through 2nd place in all classes. YRHA will also award ribbons through 2nd place for Green Reiner and Two-Handed Rookie and through 10th place for Two-Handed and NRHA Youth classes. NRHA class awards are those set forth by the NRHA rule book. NOTE: If you win an award, you must come to the Awards Table to pick up your award. If you do not pick up your award by the end of the show, you will forfeit your award.

Green Reiner Buckle

If you are a beginning non pro reiner and have not earned money in reining events, here's your chance to earn a belt buckle! Each time you show in a YRHA Green Reiner class, you can accumulate points. When you reach 30 points, you will graduate out of the class **immediately** and receive your belt buckle at the YRHA Year-End Awards Banquet. **Keep in mind, you must be a current YRHA member to earn points.** This class will not be jackpotted. No lead changes; you will ride a modified NRHA pattern. You may show one- or two-handed in any legal bit or hackamore. The number of horses in the class determines the number of points available for each place. No points for zeros or "no scores."

Saddle & Raffle Drawings

You could be the winner of a Jim Taylor FG Reining Show Saddle!!! If you are a current YRHA member (owner **and** rider if different) and you win any of the offered classes (exception is the Green Reiner Class) at the 2010 Yellowstone Slides, your name will be entered in a drawing to be held at Yellowstone Slide III. Saddle to be awarded to the owner. Saddle sponsored by **Anderson Training Stables & Yellowstone Reining Horse Association.** The drawing for the custom-made Rocky Mtn. PeeWee Reining

The PeeWee Reining will be held during the noon break on Saturday at **Yellowstone Slide III**, in the Show Arena. Must enter at the Show Office one hour prior to the event.

Robert Broadbent Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded to the winner of the 60 Years and Older Class of the **Yellowstone Slide II.** Must be a member of YRHA or CSRHA to be eligible to win this perpetual trophy, which is awarded at the YRHA Year-End Awards Banquet. Each winner's name is engraved on the trophy. If won by the same rider 3 consecutive years that rider is entitled to keep the trophy.

YRHA Affiliate Circuit Awards & Information

Rider and owner of horse must be YRHA members prior to class entered in order for points to count. Points are not counted retroactively. Circuit Awards based on class points earned in all 3 YRHA shows: Yellowstone Slide I, II and III. Pewters awarded to circuit champions and plaques to reserve champions in approved NRHA Category 1 classes. NRHA Youth and NRHA Rookie classes will be awarded plaques to both circuit champion and reserve champion. NOTE: If you have never designated which NRHA Affiliate Circuit you wish to represent, you must complete and return the NRHA Designation Form by the NRHA's August 1, 2010, deadline. If you have already designated, your designation carries forward and you will not have to resubmit the form. However, if you wish to change affiliates, you must submit the required form to NRHA by August 1, 2010.
