MRHA Stallion Stakes Program Rules and Fees

Subscribed Stallions:

Auction Stallions:

Are stallions that have donated a breeding for auction by MRHA. They are listed on our web page and any advertising that is conducted. Get of the subscribed stallions will receive two years of eligibility, for three year olds the following year and again for three year olds from the foaling year. Example: you subscribe the stallion for 2010 all three year old get are eligible for the 2010 SS class, and then again in 2014 the three year old get will be eligible for the SS class.

The Stallion Stakes Futurity class will run concurrently with other Open and Non-Pro Futurity classes at the show determined by the MRHA.

To maintain eligibility for the Stallion Stakes, the stallion owner must participate in the Stallion Service Auction each year, and the stallion must sell. If the stallion fails to sell the owner may purchase back the breeding for the same listed auction price, and therefore make the stallion still eligible.

Non Auction Stallions:

Are stallions that are included in all the eligibility requirements with the exception of the auction. These stallions have been purchased by the stallion owners and are not subject to the auction.

Stallion owners must pay half the listed stallion fee prior to the beginning of the auction process.

If there has been no listed stallion fee, or listed as private treaty then the stallion owner must buy the stallion for at least \$500.00

Owner Joins Program:

“ Guest “ Stallions can be subscribed at the show and their three year olds can compete although the stallion owner has not previously participated in the Stallion Service Donation program. The Stallion owner can subscribe a stallion by participating in the Stallion Service Auction for the following year and an admission fee of half the listed stallion service fee for that year.

The participant pays regular Stallion Stakes Futurity entry fee. To continue as a subscribed stallion, the owner must donate a breeding each year to the Auction program.

Owner Chooses not to Participate in the Program: (as outlined in preceding program)

The owner/rider of a three year old of a non-subscribed stallion or guest stallion can “buy in” for \$850.00 for Open entry or \$700.00 for Non Pro entry enrollment fee

Entry Fees:

Entry Fee for Futurity Stallion Stakes : Will be 10% of the added money in each category. However the horse does not need to be entered in any concurrent futurity class.

Payout:

10 % of the added money to top stallion owners in each class;
80% to awards (70/30) Open/NonPro).

All entry fees collected except as noted for the stallion stakes classes will be used exclusively for the Stallion Stakes awards.

Stallion owners who do not participate in the donation program and /or do not subscribe their stallions are not eligible for monetary awards. A congratulatory letter will be sent to the owners of non-subscribed stallions inviting them to participate for the following year. Any monies that would have been awarded to stallion owners who do not participate will remain in the Stallion Stakes program for future prizes.

Mare Owners who breed from “donated Stallions”

The mare owner who will breed their mare from the purchase of the donated breeding will be guaranteed that their colt will be eligible for the stallion stakes class as a three year old, regardless of the status of that stallion in the program. (Example: buy a 2006 breeding that foal would be eligible for the Stallion Stakes Class in 2010.)

That single breeding “get” would also be given a preference in their entry fee at a reduced price of 25%: (Example: open entry fee is \$350.00 reduced by 25% equals \$262.50, NonPro regular entry fee is \$250.00 reduced by 25% equals \$187.50).

In order for this to be accomplished it would be the responsibility of the Mare owner to supply MRHA with a copy of the breeding contract with the stallion owner and a copy of their Mare’s registration papers. At the registration of their foal, they would also be responsible to send copy of the foal’s papers, to MRHA. It will be MRHA responsibility to maintain that record from year to year.
